

## Summary of Legal and Contractual Obligations on Pupil Progression Plans

This informational overview is a general reference guide intended only to clarify for schools relevant legal and contractual obligations, including OPSB Policy. It is NOT a substitute for understanding federal and state guidelines and/or the appropriate state and local policies nor is it a comprehensive description of all applicable legal and contractual obligations. Additionally, it is not meant to explain or delineate OPSB strategic priorities.

OPSB expects all charter schools and charter school operators to comply with the state's requirements for Pupil Progression Plans in BESE Bulletin 1566.

	Must submit a PPP to OPSB's Office of School Performance, in accordance with the

Grade 4	According to the <u>LDE's "School System Promotion Guidance"</u> from the 2017-2018 school
Requirements	year, academic plans must:
	"Place students who score below "Basic" in at least two core subjects (ELA, math,
	science, social studies) at the end of Grade 4 on an individualized academic
	improvement plan."

	o "Address each core subject in which the student scored below 'Basic'"

	grade for students who transfer to the charter school from another state or country,

High School	Must require students to pass the required end-of-course tests in addition to
Requirements	completing the required minimum number of Carnegie units of credits to receive a
	high school diploma ( <u>BESE Bulletin 1566</u> )
Requirements for	In accordance, with BESE Bulletin 1566, summer remediation programs for students in
Summer	4 <sup>th</sup> or 8 <sup>th</sup> grade who do not meet their grade level's respective "promotion and support
Remediation	standards" must:
Programs	Be offered at no cost.
	<ul> <li>Include transportation to and from the remediation summer site.</li> </ul>
